## What is new on drinking water?

- Revised directive adopted on 16 December 2020
- Article 11 focus of ECHA's tasks
  - Minimum hygiene requirements
  - Better functioning of the internal market
- Several other changes (outside ECHA's scope)
  - Update existing safety standards
  - 'Risk-based approach' for whole supply chain
  - Access to water obligations
  - Improved transparency for consumers





## **Article 11 – Scope**

- Applies to:
  - Materials in new installations, repair works or reconstruction in existing installations
  - Abstraction, treatment, storage or distribution
- Aims to protect human health by preventing:
  - Adverse effects on colour, odour or taste
  - Microbial growth
  - Leaching of contaminants into water
- Focus on health and hygiene aspects
  - Product safety covered elsewhere (e.g. Construction Products Regulations)





## **Article 11 – Principles**

- Tools for minimum hygiene requirements:
  - 4 European positive lists (ECHA)
  - Methodologies for testing and accepting starting substances, compositions & constituents to lists (ECHA & Joint Research Centre - JRC)
  - Procedures and methods for testing and accepting final materials based on European positive list entries (JRC)
    - European standard for testing and assessment of products
    - EU mark (label)

| Adoption of procedure for applications and proposals submitted to ECHA (Art. 11(5)) - <b>Delegated Act – Act 3</b>  | Not specified in legal text |
| Earliest application or proposal submitted to ECHA  | Jan 2025                    |

# ECHA's work to support DWD implementation







### **ECHA's tasks**

- Task 1: Support the Commission to develop 1<sup>st</sup> European positive lists
  - Timeline: January 2021 to January 2025
- Task 2: Set up procedures and systems to maintain European positive lists
  - Timeline: January 2021 to January 2025
- Task 3: Maintain the European positive lists
  - Timeline: from January 2025 onwards
  - Review of 1<sup>st</sup> European positive lists within 15 years (by 2040)



# Task 1: Support the Commission to develop 1<sup>st</sup> European positive lists

- 1<sup>st</sup> European positive lists
  - Based on existing national positive lists and provisions
  - Including Plastic Food Contact Material List of Plastics Regulation 10/2011
- Member States notified their lists in July 2021
- Next steps:
  - Processing and compiling national submissions
  - Reviewing extent to which notified lists represent whole EU market
  - Assigning expiry dates
  - Commission, with support from Member State expert group, adopts 1<sup>st</sup> European positive lists

# Task 2: Set up procedures and systems to maintain European positive lists

- Development of:
  - Information requirements
    - Substance/composition identity
    - Hazard information
    - Migration data
  - Risk assessment methods
  - Application procedure
    - Submission and development of opinion by Committee for Risk Assessment (RAC)
- Setup of IT systems for application procedure
  - Applications and proposals will be in IUCLID format
- Aim to be ready in January 2024





## **Task 3: Maintaining lists**

Industry


#### **Submission of application**

- Application to add entry to European positive lists
- Review application to keep entry on European positive lists

Member States

#### Submission of proposal

- Proposal to add entry to European positive lists
- Proposal to remove entry from lists
- Proposal to update entry of substance on lists



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## Looking to the future







## New obligations arising in 2025

- Before adoption of European positive lists (Jan 2025)
  - Existing legislation remains in force
    - National positive lists will be subject to maintenance
    - EU plastic material list subject to additions and updates
    - NB. EU legislation subject to revision in coming years
- After adoption of European positive lists (Jan 2025)
  - Use EU positive lists are used for new materials/repairs
  - Apply to ECHA to renew/add a new/remove list entries
  - Send relevant data related to applications and proposals to RAC, if requested





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## **Summary**

- New obligations for drinking water contact materials from January 2025
- Information requirements and risk assessment methods are in preparation – will make use of past work in relevant fields (REACH, Biocides, plastic food contact materials, 4MSI)
- New IT application system in preparation; applications made in IUCLID format
- 1<sup>st</sup> European positive lists for contact materials will be adopted based on existing national lists, alongside expiry dates for each entry
