

Principles of scientific integrity and transparency

members act in their personal capacity, independent of institutional or political interests



members must inform the chair of any potential conflict of interest



Members are contractually bound to be impartial



Both the science advice and the process for evidence gathering are public

SAM uses only publicly available evidence



Topic: Microplastic Pollution and its Impacts

- A 'pre-scoping' workshop took place, 26 April, at the European Commission's premises in Brussels with experts
- The workshop suggested that Scientific Advisors produce:
 - a first short document by end June with its initial observations on the topic as well as intended subsequent steps, pending endorsement by the College of European Commissioners
 - An explanatory note before the end of 2018
 - A scientific opinion in early 2019
- The explanatory note would critically review existing literature on the issue covering:
 - 1. The natural sciences;
 - 2. Social and behavioural sciences and humanities;
 - 3. Political, legal and regulatory sciences; and
 - 4. Modelling
