Antoine Buchet has a Master of Law from the University of Paris II and a degree in criminology from the Institute of Criminology of Paris.

Antoine began his career as a judge, then worked for more than 10 years for the Ministry of Justice and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. His responsibilities covered in particular human rights law (proceedings before the European Court of Human Rights, negotiation of Protocol 14 to the Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms) and international criminal law (negotiation of the Statute of the International Criminal Court and of the International Convention for the Protection of All Persons from Enforced Disappearance).

After having worked for 3 years for the French Permanent Representation to the European Union, as a Justice Counsellor, Antoine joined the European Commission in April 2004. He has worked for the Directorate General for Justice, for the Secretariat-General and for the Legal Service, as from 2014. His fields of expertise in EU law cover international private law, fundamental rights, access to documents and various institutional matters. He has written a few articles, mostly on international criminal law and EU institutional law.
