Suppliers of articles submit info to ECHA

- 
- Establish a **database** + **Enable submission** of info by EU suppliers of articles
  - Provide **access to the database** to “waste treatment operators”, and to consumers (upon request)



**MSs**

- **Transpose** into national law
- **Enforce**

*Reduce the content of hazardous substances in materials and products, including recycled materials*

Push for **substitution** of substances of concern and **prevention** of (hazardous) waste generation



Contributing to a more circular economy: improve waste treatment operations

Increase authorities' information basis on substances in articles



- **July 2018:**
  - ECHA receives the task to develop a major new database in 18 months, no resources agreed
- **Autumn 2018:**
  - Written consultation of Member States and stakeholders on first draft scenario
  - Workshop 22-23 October 2018
- **Spring 2019:**
  - Resources agreed, scope and legal requirements clarified (see COM non-paper)
  - Written consultation of Member States and stakeholders on draft information requirements

## Transparent & participatory process

- Written **consultations** on draft scenario, draft information requirements, material categories and safe use instructions
- Active **engagement with stakeholder community**: 62 physical and virtual meetings or speaking engagements since mid 2018
- Opportunities to influence and give feedback
  - **IT user group** started
  - **Dissemination user group** under consideration (waste operators and consumer organisations)

## Where are we now?

- Final information requirements published
- Scope and legal requirements clarified in FAQs
- IUCLID format published
  
- IT development aims to deliver a “prototype” version of the SCIP database Q1 2020

## What's next?

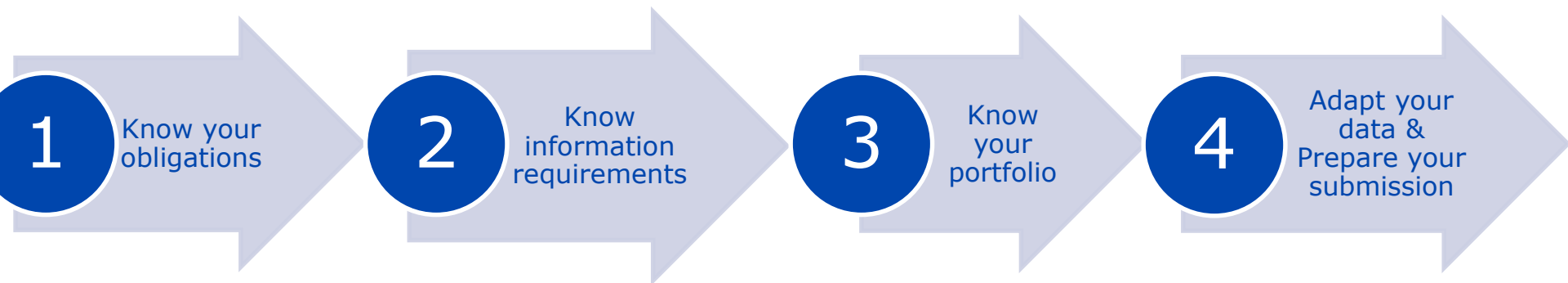
- Release of the prototype (v0, Q1 2020)
  - Functionalities to create dossier
  - No public view on the data yet
- Next phase of development
  - Submission functionalities released as they become available
  - Testing phase, implementation of improvements
  - Analysis of dissemination portal
- Release of SCIP v1 (planned for OCT '20)


